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**Author:** Unknown, although Jewish tradition suggests Ezra.

**Date Written:** Between 450 - 430 BC, after the initial return from Babylon.

**Period of Time that the Book Covers:** 1<sup>st</sup>-2<sup>nd</sup> Chronicles covers about ~475 years from ~1011BC – 538BC between when David's reign begins and when Jerusalem is destroyed by Babylon.

Comparing the Chronicles with Samuel and kings reveals that this account of Israel's past is shaped to address the needs of the community recently returned from Babylonian exile. - **NOW:**
  - o *How do I personally need to respond to the timeless truth?*
  - o *Is there something I need to be doing better or differently in order to apply the timeless truth?*

### **Key People:**

Jeroboam	Led the rebellion against Rehoboam; reigned as the first king over the northern tribes
Josiah	Judah's last righteous king
Rehoboam	Solomon's son who succeeded him as king; the kingdom split under his leadership
Solomon	Son of King David through Bathsheba; vast empire; wisest man who ever lived (next to our Lord); intermarriage led to disobedience and judgment
