 - **Tip** --> use the “**THEN**” and then relate it to how Christians should apply the “**THEN**” today

- **NOW:**
 - *How do I personally need to respond to the timeless truth?*
 - *Is there something I need to be doing better or differently in order to apply the timeless truth?*

you have need again for someone to teach you the elementary principles of the oracles of God,

and you have come to need milk and not solid food.

¹³ For everyone who partakes only of milk

is not accustomed to the word of righteousness,

for he is an infant.

¹⁴ But solid food

is for the mature,

who because of practice have their senses trained to discern good and evil.

Introduction to Philemon

Author: Paul

Recipient: Philemon

Date Written: ~60-62 AD.

Theme of the Book: Manual on Forgiveness

Outline of the Book:

- I. Prayer (1-7)
- II. Petition (8-16)
- III. Promise (17-25)

Key People:

Philemon	Christian slave owner
Onesimus	Slave who receives Christ under Paul's ministry and must now return to his master, Philemon

Summary Statement: Philemon develops the transition from bondage to brotherhood that is brought about by Christian love and forgiveness. Just as Philemon was shown mercy through the grace of Christ, so he must graciously forgive his repentant runaway who has returned as a brother in Christ. Paul wrote the letter as his personal appeal that Philemon receive Onesimus even as he would receive Paul. This letter was also addressed to other Christians in Philemon's circle, because Paul wanted it to have an impact on the Colossian church as a whole. – *Talk Thru the Bible, Thomas Nelson, 1983.*
