Theme of the Book: In Him: Our Position in Christ **or** The Eternal Plan of God

Outline of the Book:

- I. Christian Position (1-3)
- II. Christian Practice (4-6)

Key Chapters:

- 1 Chosen and sealed
- 2 Saved by grace; united in one body
- 3 The mystery of the church
- 4 Unity in the body; spiritual gifts; the former life
- 5 Walking in the Spirit; home responsibilities
- 6 Slaves and masters; believer’s armor

Key Passages:

- 1:3-14 Father, Son, and Holy Spirit in salvation; election
- 4:11-16 The gift of leaders to the body
- 5:22-25 Biblical role for husbands and wives

Author: The Apostle Paul

Date Written: ~ AD 60-62 – during Paul’s first Roman imprisonment.

Theme of the Book: Joy and Unity **or** Basic Christian Living

Outline of the Book:

- I. Partakers with Christ (1)
- II. People of Christ (2)
- III. Pursuit of Christ (3)
- IV. Power of Christ (4)

Key Chapters:

- 2 Unity of the Body; the kenosis, work out your salvation; deity of Christ
- 3 Warnings against Judaizers
- 4 Unity in all things; anxious for nothing; thankful for their gift

Key Passages:

- 1:6 God perfectly accomplishes His purposes
- 4:12-13 Christ’s strength
- 4:19 God supplies all of our needs

Summary Statement: “Paul wants to encourage the Philippians to live out their lives as citizens of a heavenly colony, as evidenced by a growing commitment to service to God and to one another. The way of life that Paul encourages was manifested uniquely in Jesus Christ; it was also evident in the lives of Paul, Timothy, and Epaphroditus.” – *The ESV Study Bible, Crossway, 2001*

Date Written: ~ AD 60-62 – during Paul's first Roman imprisonment.

Theme of the Book: The All-Sufficiency of Christ

Outline of the Book:

- I. Sufficiency of Christ (1-2)
- II. Submission to Christ (3-4)

Key Chapters:

- 1 Paul's prayer; the exalted Christ
- 3 Position and practice of the believer

Key Passages:

- 1:15-16 Christ the image of God and Creator – the firstborn over all creation
- 2:16-17 Error of legalism
- 3:1-2 Set mind on things above

Summary Statement: "Christ is Lord over all creation, including the invisible realm. He has secured redemption for his people, enabling them to participate with him in his death, resurrection, and fullness." – *The ESV Study Bible, Crossway, 2001.*

Introduction to Philemon

Author: Paul

Recipient: Philemon

Date Written: ~60-62 AD.

Theme of the Book: Manual on Forgiveness

Outline of the Book:

- I. Prayer (1-7)
- II. Petition (8-16)
- III. Promise (17-25)

Key People:

Philemon	Christian slave owner
Onesimus	Slave who receives Christ under Paul's ministry and must now return to his master, Philemon

Summary Statement: Philemon develops the transition from bondage to brotherhood that is brought about by Christian love and forgiveness. Just as Philemon was shown mercy through the grace of Christ, so he must graciously forgive his repentant runaway who has returned as a brother in Christ. Paul wrote the letter as his personal appeal that Philemon receive Onesimus even as he would receive Paul. This letter was also addressed to other Christians in Philemon's circle, because Paul wanted it to have an impact on the Colossian church as a whole. – *Talk Thru the Bible, Thomas Nelson, 1983.*
