Every Stroke Inspired: Embracing Jesus' High View of Scripture - Pt. 2

Matthew 5:17-20

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MAIN IDEA: The heart of the Sermon on the Mount is Jesus' explanation of the Old Testament Scripture—the fact that He didn't come to abolish it but to fulfill it. In other words, Jesus embraced the Old Testament and held a high view of it during His life in ministry. But the question for you is: What is your view of the Bible? As citizens of Jesus' kingdom, our view of Scripture must replicate Jesus' view—that is, a true subject of Jesus' spiritual kingdom must have a right relationship to Scripture

"Not the Smallest Letter or Stroke"

- Lit., "One yōta or one little horn, no not at all shall pass away."
- "Smallest letter"
 - o In Greek
 - Its name is "iω̃τα", pronounced yōta.
 - It resembles our lower case "i".
 - It's equivalent to the English letter "I".
 - In Hebrew
 - Its name is "yodh", pronounced yōth.
 - It's equivalent to English "Y".
 - It looks like our apostrophe:
 - > 66,000 yodhs in the OT
 - Jesus says, "Not one shall pass!"

"Not the Smallest Letter or Stroke"

- Lit., "One yōta or one little horn, no not at all shall pass away."
- "Stroke"
 - o Lit.. "little horn"
 - The small pen stroke or projection that distinguishes one Hebrew letter from another
 - o Cf. the English capitals of O and Q
 - o] beth] vs. ɔ] kaf]
